



Council Tax Support Scheme 2018/19

Having read the reasons why we are consulting on the Council Tax Support Scheme for 2018/19, we would like to know your views on options for reducing the scheme for working age claimants from 87.5% to either 85%, 82.5% or 80%. Examples for each option are provided below. The questions should only take a couple of minutes to complete and all responses are completely anonymous.

- Q1 To what extent do you agree or disagree that the Council should reduce the maximum amount of Council Tax Support available to working age claimants from 87.5% to 85% (pensionable age claimants will still be entitled to up to 100% support).

Based on this year's Council Tax, working age claimants living in a band A property would see their Council Tax Support reduce by just over 50p per week if they are a couple and just under 40p per week if they are single.

- Q2 To what extent do you agree or disagree that the Council should reduce the maximum amount of Council Tax Support available to working age claimants from 87.5% to 82.5% (pensionable age claimants will still be entitled to up to 100% support).

Based on this year's Council Tax, working age claimants living in a band A property would see their Council Tax Support reduce by just over £1.00 per week if they are a couple and just under 80p per week if they are single.

- Q3 To what extent do you agree or disagree that the Council should reduce the maximum amount of Council Tax Support available to working age claimants from 87.5% to 80% (pensionable age claimants will still be entitled to up to 100% support).

Based on this year's Council Tax, working age claimants living in a band A property would see their Council Tax Support reduce by just over £1.55 per week if they are a couple and just under £1.20 per week if they are single.
