As some of the labour is from core budgets and some was provided by volunteers the full cost of planting cannot be identified.

However, all the identifiable costs of tree planting activity for these trees has been funded solely by external grants, primarily through the government's £12million Nature for Climate fund.

As of February 2024, North Tyneside Council has identified and re-claimed £165,394 of government funding for planting labour, ground preparation, project design, replanting costs, weed suppression, ongoing maintenance, and the trees themselves.

3. The trees and associated sundries were supplied by established commercial nurseries that support Plant Healthy criteria.
