## **Response:**

- Please see the attached table. For the purpose of clarification and in accordance with legislation, parking contraventions are split between higher and lower penalty values depending on the severity of the impact of the offence. Bus Lane contraventions have been listed separately in the table.
- 2. Please see attached table. For the purpose of clarification, the income values provided are based on the full value of the contravention as specified in the legislation. In accordance with the legislation, a penalty charge is offered at a discounted rate of 50% of the full value if paid within 14 days of issue. The penalty charge value also increases above the full value at various statutory stages of the process if the penalty charge remains unpaid.
- 3. A request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 entitles an applicant to recorded information only. Averages are not recorded by the Authority. However, this can be calculated from the data provided in the attached table.
- 4. The Notice Processing software does not include a report that provides this data. This information could only be obtained by reviewing the case folder of each individual penalty charge notice issued in these periods.
