 - a. How many apprenticeship starts were made during this period? 22
 - b. How many apprenticeship starts were made during this period by people that had a disability? 1
 - c. How many people applied for your apprenticeships, that had a disability? 5
 - d. How many people received interviews for your apprenticeships, that had a disability? 5
 - e. How many people were unsuccessful in securing your apprenticeships, that had a disability? 4
- 3. In the next year, do you have any plans to increase the number of apprentices you employ that have a disability? We actively encourage applications from people with a disability
- 3. Do you currently offer any support initiatives to help enable disabled people to access your apprenticeships? We guarantee interview for applicants who declare a disability and provide assistance in the interview process where required
- 4. If yes, what are these initiatives?

Gov.UK definition of disability - You're disabled under the Equality Act 2010 if you have a physical or mental impairment that has a 'substantial' and 'long-term' negative effect on your ability to do normal daily activities.

What 'substantial' and 'long-term' mean

- □ 'substantial' is more than minor or trivial, eg it takes much longer than it usually would to complete a daily task like getting dressed
- 'long-term' means 12 months or more, eg a breathing condition that develops as a result of a lung infection

Gov.UK definition of apprentice - Apprentices are aged 16 or over and combine working with studying to gain skills and knowledge in a specific job.

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
