#### LICENSING ACT 2003

#### NORTH TYNESIDE COUNCIL

#### PROCEDURE FOR HEARING OF AN APPLICATION BEFORE THE LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE ("the Committee")

The four licensing objectives, as set out in the Licensing Act 2003, are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm.

Each application that comes before this Committee will be treated on its own merits, and this Licensing Authority will take its decision based upon:

- The merits of the application
- The promotion of the four licensing objectives
- The Statement of Licensing Policy of North Tyneside Council
- The guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

#### The Procedure of the Committee is as follows:

- 1. The Chair of the Committee will open the hearing and will ask all persons present at the hearing to identify themselves. The Chair will then explain the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2. The Committee will then consider any request made by a party under regulation 8(2) of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 for permission for a person to attend as a witness on his/her behalf.
- 3. The Licensing Officer will present a report to the Committee outlining the application, any relevant representations and the relevant sections of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the statutory guidance.
- 4. The Committee may ask any relevant questions they have of the Licensing Officer.
- 5. The Applicant or their representative will then be invited to address the Committee to clarify any information arising from the officer's report, if necessary.
- 6. Each of the Responsible Authorities which have made representations will be invited to address the Committee about the application, to indicate why they consider the issues they have raised to be relevant to the licensing objectives and sufficient to object to the application or notice (as applicable).

If a Responsible Authority has obtained prior permission to call a particular witness, then they may call that witness.

- 7. The Committee may ask any relevant questions they have of the Responsible Authorities.
- 8. Other Persons may ask any relevant questions they have of the Responsible Authorities.
- 9. The Applicant or their representative may ask any relevant questions they have of the Responsible Authorities.
- 10. Each of the Other Persons who have made representations will be invited to address the Committee about the application, indicating why they consider the issues they have raised to be relevant to the licensing objectives and sufficient to object to the application or notice (as applicable).

If any Other Person has obtained prior permission to call a particular witness, then they may call that witness.

<u>Note</u>: In order to avoid repetition and to expedite proceedings at the hearing, objectors within the same group of Other Persons are encouraged to appoint an agreed spokesperson to address the Committee.

- 11. The Committee may ask any relevant questions they have of the Other Persons or their witness(es).
- 12. The Responsible Authorities may ask any relevant questions they have of the Other Persons or their witness(es).
- 13. The Applicant or their representative may ask any relevant questions of the Other Persons or their witness(es).
- 14. The Applicant or their representative will be invited to address the Committee, as to why they consider the issues raised by the Responsible Authorities and Other Persons to be irrelevant to the licensing objectives and why they consider the Committee should grant their application or notice (as applicable).

If the Applicant has obtained prior permission to call a particular witness, then they may call that witness.

- 15. The Committee may ask any relevant questions they have of the Applicant, their representative or their witness(es).
- 16. The Responsible Authorities may ask any relevant questions they have of the Applicant, their representatives or their witness(es).
- 17. Any of the Other Persons may ask any relevant questions they have of the Applicant, their representative or their witness(es).

- 18. The Chair of the Committee will invite each of the Responsible Authorities to make a brief closing statement. Each Responsible Authority should ideally take no longer than 10 minutes to make their closing statements
- 19. The Chair will invite each of the Other Persons to make a brief closing statement. Each of the Other Persons will be entitled to a maximum of 10 minutes in which to make their closing statements.
- 20 The Chair will invite the Applicant or their representative to make a brief closing statement. Each Applicant should ideally take no longer than 10 minutes to make their closing statements.
- 21. The Chair will ask all parties if they are satisfied that they have said all they wish to.
- 22. The Committee will retire in private to consider the application and make its determination. The Legal Adviser will be present to ensure that all matters of law, evidence and procedure are adhered to appropriately but will not take part in the decision.
- 23 In considering any representations or a notice made by any party, the Committee may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as the case may be) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.
- 24 The Committee shall disregard any information given by a party or by any person to whom permission to appear at the hearing is given by the Committee, which is not relevant to:
  - their application, representations or a notice (as the case may be) or, in the case of another person, the application, representations or notice of the party requesting their attendance; and
  - (ii) the promotion of the licensing objectives or, in relation to a hearing to consider a notice given by a chief officer of police, the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective.
- <u>NB</u> Parties are reminded that any documentary or other information or evidence they wish to produce in support of their application or representation must have been disclosed to all parties prior to the hearing taking place. Late representations, documents or evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties present.
- 25. The Committee will return to announce its decision. A written notice of the decision will be provided to app parties in accordance with statutory requirements. The decision letter will include the reasons for the decision, and any conditions placed upon the licence (if granted) and the licensing objective(s) they relate to. The notification of decision will include information on a party's right to appeal against the Committee's decision.

#### **General Matters**

#### 1. **Expectations on parties**

The Licensing Authority expects all parties to a hearing to endeavour to address any issues openly and to work towards an amicable resolution, if at all possible, prior to the hearing taking place.

All parties will be expected to:

- (i) demonstrate which of the four licensing objectives are addressed in relation to each of the issues they wish to raise at the hearing; and
- (ii) draw to the Committee's attention any relevant aspects of the National Guidance or local Statement of Licensing Policy which they also consider are particularly relevant to the Committee's consideration of the issues the party(ies) has/have raised.

#### 2. Agreement that a hearing is unnecessary

A Licensing Authority can dispense with holding a hearing if all persons concerned (applicants and parties raising a representation) give notice to the Licensing Authority prior to the hearing date that they consider it unnecessary.

Where all such persons have given such notice, and the Licensing Authority agrees that a hearing is unnecessary, the Licensing Authority will give notice to the parties that the hearing has been dispensed with.

#### 3. Failure of parties to attend

The hearing may proceed in the absence of any party who has informed the Licensing Authority that they do not intend to attend or be represented at the hearing.

If a party fails to attend or be represented at a hearing without notifying the Licensing Authority, the Committee may adjourn the hearing to a specific date if it considers it to be in the public interest to do so, or alternatively may proceed with the hearing in the party's absence. In the interests of the other parties, costs and efficiency, hearings will generally proceed notwithstanding the absence of any party (including the Applicant).

Where it is decided to proceed in a party's absence, all notices and representations received from the absent party will be considered by the Committee.

If, in exceptional circumstances, a decision is made to adjourn a hearing all parties will be advised of the date, time and venue to which the hearing has been adjourned.

#### 4. **Questioning of parties**

The Licensing Authority will generally allow all parties to ask questions of another party present, but this decision will be taken on a case by case basis and in some exceptional circumstances (a reason will be given) cross examination may be prohibited.

#### 5. **Further clarification**

When addressing the Committee each party shall respond specifically to any points of which it received notice (with the Notice of Hearing) upon which the Committee was seeking clarification.

#### 6. Questioning by Legal Adviser

The legal adviser to the Committee may ask questions on behalf of, or in addition to, the Committee members themselves.

#### 7. Hearsay evidence

Hearsay evidence will be admissible provided that it is relevant. The weight to be attributed to hearsay evidence will be a matter for the Committee.

#### 8. Persons behaving in a disruptive manner

The Committee has the right to exclude any person disrupting the hearing, at their discretion. The Committee can refuse to allow that person to return or, alternatively, may permit him/her to return on such conditions as the Committee may decide. Any person required to leave the hearing may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the Committee in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

#### 9. No decision-making by Ward Members

A member of the Licensing Committee shall not be entitled to participate in any decision-making in relation to any licensing application concerning premises in the Ward for which he/she serves as Councillor.

#### 1.0 Summary / Purpose of Report

#### Licensing Sub-Committee

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 provides that, where representations have been received from a Responsible Authority or Other Person in respect of an application for a licence, a variation of a licence or a review of a licence, a hearing must be held to consider them. Sub-Committees have been established in accordance with provisions of the Act for the purpose of hearing such applications.
- 1.2 The Sub-Committee is asked to consider and determine the application from Copenhagen 1801 Limited for the Variation of a Premise Licence in relation to Manhattans, 85-87 High Street West, Wallsend.
- 1.3 A representative from the applicant has been invited to attend the meeting to put forward its case in support of the application. All persons making relevant representations have also been invited to attend.

#### 1.4 Representations from Responsible Authorities and Other Persons

The application has been forwarded to the Chief Officer of Police, Fire Authority, Local Planning Authority, Environmental Health Authority, Health and Safety Enforcement Agency, Licensing Authority, Director of Public Health, Weights and Measures Authority, Home Office Immigration Enforcement and the Local Safeguarding Children Board with a view to any of these Responsible Authorities inspecting the premises if deemed appropriate by them and to enable them to comment on the application. The application has been advertised at the premises, in a local newspaper and also on the Council Website as prescribed. A representation has been made by The Chief Officer of Police. This is attached at **Appendix 5.** 

#### 1.5 Authority to make decisions

In relation to an Application for the variation of a Premises Licence the Licensing Sub-Committee can, under the Licensing Act 2003:

- modify the conditions of the Licence; or
- reject the whole or part of the Application.

Once the Sub-Committee has reached a decision, the decision and reasons for the decision must be given in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 and the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

#### 2.0 Background

**2.1** This report relates to an application for the Variation of an existing Premise Licence in respect of Manhattans, 85-87 High Street West, Wallsend.

The licence currently permits the following licensing activities and times:

Supply of Alcohol (on and off the premises), Exhibition of a Film, Performance of Live Music, Playing of Recorded Music, Performance of Dance and Entertainment of a similar description to live music etc.

• Every Day 11.00 – 02.00

#### Late Night Refreshment

• Every Day 23.00 - 02.00

#### **General Opening Times**

• Every Day 11.00 – 02.00

#### **Non Standard Timings**

- All licensable activities extended for a one hour period on the Friday, Saturday and Sunday of a Bank Holiday weekend, Maundy Thursday, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.
- For an additional hour on the day that GMT changes to BST.
- The licensable activities specified in this licence may be provided from the end of the specified finish times on any day which is New Year's Eve to the beginning of the start times on the following day (New Year's day).
- 2.2 In 2018 an application was submitted for the grant of a Premises Licence in respect of Manhattans, 85-87 High Street West, Wallsend that was considered by the Licensing Sub-Committee on 12 June 2018, following a representation received from Northumbria Police. The applicant requested that the licensable activity hours be permitted until 03.00 on Friday and Saturday evenings and that the opening hours be extended 30 minutes after the end of permitted licensable activities every day. The Sub-Committee determined that a Premises Licence should be granted with appropriate conditions but with different hours to those applied for by the Applicant. The permitted hours for the provision of the licensable activities and the hours during which the Premises are to be open to the Public was determined to be those outlined in paragraph 2.1 above.

# 3.0 The Application for the Variation of a Premises Licence under Section 34 of The Licensing Act 2003

- **3.1** The Application for the variation of the Premises Licence is made pursuant to Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the relevant Section of the Act dealing with the determination of such an Application is contained in Section 35 of the Act.
- **3.2** The variation application is to extend the hours for licensable activities on a Friday and Saturday as follows:
  - 1. Supply of Alcohol (on and off the premises), Exhibition of a Film, Live Music, Recorded Music, Performance of Dance, Anything of a similar description to live music, recorded music or performance of dance as follows:
  - Sunday Thursday 11.00 02.00 No Change
  - Friday and Saturday 11.00 03.00 An extension of 1 hour each day
  - 2. Late night refreshment as follows:
  - Sunday Thursday 23.00 02.00 No Change
  - Friday and Saturday 23.00 03.00 An extension of 1 hour each day

- 3. Non-standard timings as follows (no change):
  - All licensable activities extended for a one hour period on the Friday, Saturday and Sunday of a Bank Holiday weekend, Maundy Thursday, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and New Years Day
  - An additional hour on the day that GMT changes to BST. The licensable activities specified in the licence may be provided from the end of the specified finish times on any day which is New Year's Eve to the beginning of the start times on the following day (New Year's Day)

#### 3. Opening times

- Sunday Thursday 11.00 02.30 An extension of 30 minutes each day
- Friday and Saturday 11.00 03.30 An extension of 1 hour 30 minutes
- **3.3** The Application for the Variation is attached at **Appendix 1**, a plan of the premises is attached at **Appendix 2** and a map of the area is attached at **Appendix 3**.
- **3.4** A copy of the current premises licence is attached at **Appendix 4**.

#### 4.0 Promotion of Licensing Objectives

The applicant has indicated that they do not consider any further steps are necessary in the operating schedule as it believes that the current licence conditions adequately promote the licensing objectives.





1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

2. The responsible person shall ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

# The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 - with effect from 1st October 2010 as amended on 1st October 2014

3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premise licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3)The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

4. The responsible person shall ensure that:

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures

(i) beer or cider:  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2014 with effect from 28th May 2014

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a)"duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b)"permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

P is the permitted price,

the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii)

the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d)

"relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e)

"valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

# Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. The operator shall ensure that at all times when the premises are open for any licensable activity there is sufficient, competent staff on duty at the premises for the purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the licence and for preventing crime and disorder.
- 2. The operator and designated premises supervisor shall conduct a risk assessment for the general operation of the premises and in the case of individual bespoke events.
- 3. A CCTV system shall be installed and maintained in proper working order. Such a system shall:
  - i) Ensure the coverage of the main bar and function room and all entrances and exits to the licensed premises internally and externally;
  - ii) Provide continuous recording facilities for each camera to a good standard of clarity;
  - iii) Such recordings shall be retained (on tape, disc or otherwise) for a period of 28 days in real time;
  - iv) Shall be supplied promptly to a police officer or representative on request;
  - v) This CCTV shall be in operation at all times the premises are in use;
  - vi) The system with recording facility and any recording will be stored in a suitable and secure manner;
  - vii) The CCTV system will display on any recording the correct time and date of the recording;
  - viii) A system will be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image and a complete audit trail maintained.
- 4. Signs are to be placed both internally and externally at the premises indicating to customers that CCTV is in operation on the premises. The signs are to be a minimum of A5 size.
- 5. A member of staff who is trained in the operation of the CCTV and who is able to download images onto disc or otherwise shall be on site during opening times in order to supply such data to the Licensing Authority or Northumbria Police on request.
- 6. The premises licence holder will operate a Challenge 21 Policy whilst the premises are open to the public. This is to be in operation by the door supervisors and bar staff:
  - i) All members of door staff and bar staff shall seek credible photographic proof of age from any person who appears to be under the age of 21 years and is either seeking to enter the premises or purchase alcohol
  - ii) Such credible photographic proof will be a current passport, a full driving licence or proof of age card carrying the PASS logo
  - iii) All staff including door supervisors will receive training regarding this and its proper application policy; this training will be refreshed every six months and documented; such training records will be produced to a police officer or representative of Northumbria Police immediately on request

- 7. All members of staff to have adequate training in the Licensing Act 2003 and any subsequent variation. This training is to be given on staff entering employment and refreshed every six months. The training is to be documented and records kept on file for inspection by the Local Authority, Trading Standards, Police Officer or representative on request.
- 8. The designated premises supervisor is to provide written authorisation to all staff involved in the sale of alcohol; such authorisation is to be retained as part of the staff training records.
- 9. A refusals register is to be kept and maintained on the premises. This shall be documented and kept on file for inspection by the Local Authority, Trading Standards, Police Officer or representative on request.
- 10. When regulated entertainment involving the playing of recorded music is taking place, all lobby doors shall be kept closed except for the purposes of access and egress.
- 11. A lobby and lobby door should be fitted to the rear fire door to the first floor area whenever it is determined by the applicant to use the external area, such door to be compliant with fire regulations. The lobby doors must be self-closing to minimise noise breakout when customers enter and leave the premises.
- 12. On Thursdays to Saturdays, when the premises are open for any licensable activity, a minimum of 2 door supervisors will be employed at the premises from 2100 hours to close of business. On all other days, if the premises provide licensed activities after 12 midnight, a minimum of 2 door supervisors will be employed at the premises from 2200 hours.
- 13. At any time that the first floor function room is used for licensable activities after 12 midnight the maximum customer capacity of the premises as a whole will be restricted to 300 persons.

## APPLICATION FOR A VARIATION OF THE LICENCE AT MAHATTANS, 87 HIGH STREET WEST, WALLSEND, NE28 8JD.

Premises licence number OOCK/18/0476 Premises licence holder Copenhagen 1801 Ltd.

Manhattans is situated on Wallsend High Street in close proximity to other night time economy premises. Within easy walk are other bars, restaurants and fast food take aways. Manhattans is the only premises with a late licence to supply alcohol until 02:00 hours.

The uniformed police have been called to this premise on many occasions recently and historically with Officers responding to calls to the premises during and after the closing times. The crimes associated with this premises are various. Please see attached document for the crime/s and incidents breakdown for the period Jan 2018 to date of this document.

An email was received by Mr Kirkpatrick Licensing officer for the Police, from Sinton's Solicitors in June 2019, outlining a proposal from their client to extend the operating hours of manhattans until 03:00 hours closing at 03:30 hours.

A reply was sent indicating the police could not support any further extension to the licensable activity.

May I request the committee to have regard for Guidance issued under section 182 (April 2017) of the Licensing Act 2003 section 10.23 This is primarily a vertical drinking establishment it is the premise where people congregate to in Wallsend as a late night venue, such establishments can have a significant bearing on the likelihood for crime and disorder.

Manhattans current licensable activity:

Every day from 11:00 to 02:00 hours, closing at 02:00 hours.

Manhattans requested all licensable activity:

- Sunday to Thursday from 11:00 to 02:00 hours, closing at 02:30 hours.
- Friday and Saturday from 11:00 to 03:00 hours, closing at 03:30 hours.

The extension of all licensable activity to 03:00 hours Friday and Saturday will exacerbate the situation, any further extension will increase the crime and disorder and the cumulative impact on the wider area of the High street in Wallsend. The extension of the times will have further impact on the community of Wallsend. The amount of people coming out of Manhattans will increase alcohol related crime and disorder. At present there is a trend on the High street that sees the crime and disorder rise as the week end approaches.

The reoccurring crimes associated with Manhattans are violence against the person, the crimes range from a Sec 18 assault to common assault. Drunk and disorderly to public order Sec 4 and 5 offences.

At present the majority of the premises on the high street close between midnight and 00:30 hours during the week, and 01:00 to 01:30 hours at weekends. If Manhattans has an even later licence, this area of the High street would have a further increase in alcohol related crime and disorder.

May I request the committee to have a regard for North Tyneside councils statement of licensing policy section 5.29. The council is aware that there is no general presumption in favour of lengthening licensing hours under the Licensing Act 2003

May I request the committee to have a regard for North Tyneside councils statement of licensing policy section 10.1In considering any licence applications before it, the council shall have regard to Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1988 which requires a local authority to do all that it reasonably can to prevent crime and disorder in its locality.

The fact that the Premises are already operating as licensed premises and have a "track record" this is often, the best indicator for what will happen at premises in the future, is what has occurred at premises in the past. In April 2018, the Licensing sub- committee heard that the crime and disorder since March 2017, which is when the applicant took over responsibility for premises, up to May 2018 there have been 63 recorded crimes, the majority of which involved violence.

During an incident on Friday night into Saturday morning of the 03 August 2019 at 02:11 hours, police stopped to request a group of people standing in the road outside Manhattans to move back onto the pavement, a male was verbally abusive to an officer. The male was drunk and became very aggressive towards the officers who were trying to arrest him, the officers requested assistance as the crowd had formed around the officers and felt

threatened. As additional officers arrived, a further 4 people were arrested for being drunk and disorderly. The officer who was dealing with the above incident commented in an email to Insp Story Neighboured Inspector for Wallsend, "this is a regular occurring theme with large groups of drunken people exiting Manhattans; the staff close the doors and leave to the police to deal with the mess". A DVD will follow this document. It's about 2 minutes viewing time.

Northumbria Police could not support the application for the further extension of licensable activity

It is the request of Northumbria police that the application to vary the premises licence application for Manhattans is refused.
