Cabinet agreed to the proposed merger of the coronial areas of North Tyneside and Newcastle upon Tyne and the Business Case for such a merger appended to the Cabinet report was endorsed.

The merger of the Coronial areas of Newcastle upon Tyne and North Tyneside was agreed by Cabinet on 28 November 2022. Cabinet also agreed the Business Case for the merger presented to Cabinet on that date and agreed that any amendments to the final Business Case submitted to the Ministry of Justice and the Chief Coroner could be made by the Chief Executive in consultation with the Elected Mayor.

Minor amendments have been made to the Business Case, namely, the addition of a list of consultees, a map of the Coronial areas to be merged and the updating of figures appearing in Annex A together with the correction of typographical errors

The decision to make the minor amendments enables a finalised Business Case to be submitted to the Ministry of Justice as part of the proposed merger process agreed by Cabinet.
