**5. Executive summary** (taken from written report)

This Record of Decision relates to the approval given by the Cabinet Member for Environment to introduce road humps on Esplanade Place and Esplanade Avenue (rear) in the vicinity of their junctions with South Parade, Whitley Bay, and to set aside one objection received to the proposal.

**6. Alternative Options considered**

Option 1 – Approve the recommendations set out in section 1.2 of the report.

Option 2 – Not approve the recommendations set out in section 1.2 of the report.

**7. Decision(s)**

The Cabinet Member for Environment has considered the objection and has decided to:

- (1) set aside the objection in the interests of increasing safety for all road users and contributing to ensuring that highway conditions are conducive to support greater usage of cycling, walking and wheeling; and
- (2) determine that road humps should be installed in accordance with the proposal.

**8. Reasons for the Decision(s)**

Regarding the objection from Mr O – the Cabinet Member for Environment noted that the scheme sought to facilitate active travel, with wider health benefits, and to provide an improved walking and cycling link between the sea front and the town centre and Metro station. The Cabinet Member for Environment further noted that the external Government funding being used to deliver the scheme was specifically for projects which supported the use of more sustainable modes of transport.
