### **4. Executive summary** (To be taken from written report)

The Authority has a statutory duty to collect and dispose of household waste arising within the borough. Annually it deals with around 94,000 tonnes of waste material with an overall cost to the Authority of £11.339millon to collect, dispose of and treat.

The Authority has an existing contract which is due to expire in 2022. Negotiations have been undertaken to extend the current arrangement.

At its meeting of 25 November 2019 Cabinet agreed to delegate authority to the Head of Environment, Housing and Leisure in consultation with the Head of Law and Governance, Head of Resources, Cabinet Member for Finance and Resources, Cabinet Member for Environment and Transport to conclude and enter into the necessary agreements to extend the residual waste contract with the current waste provider.

In accordance with that decision negotiations have concluded, and this report seeks authority to enter a contract extension for waste disposal services and a lease for the waste transfer site.

To authorise the contract extension and lease.

Not to authorise the contract extension and lease.

### 6. Decision(s)
