This Record of Decision relates to the approval given by the Cabinet Member for Environment to make variations to restrictions on traffic movements which involve a prohibition of entry and of right hand turns and left hand turns for vehicular traffic at a number of locations and a one-way restriction in one location, in the vicinity of East Street, Sea Banks and Percy Gardens, Tynemouth, and set aside two objections received to the proposals.

8. Reasons for the Decision(s)

Regarding the objection from Mr M – the Cabinet Member for Environment noted that 'before' and 'after' parking surveys would be undertaken in the area so as to observe any impacts which might arise following scheme implementation. The Cabinet Member for Environment further noted that the proposal formed part of the Sea Front Sustainable Route proposals, which will provide improved cycling, walking and wheeling links to local destinations in coastal areas of North Tyneside.

Regarding the objection from Mr D – the Cabinet Member for Environment noted that the re-routing of motorised traffic associated with the proposals would not be expected to pose any capacity issues at the Percy Park Road-Grand Parade roundabout or to have any substantial impact on local air quality. The Cabinet Member for Environment further noted that the proposal formed part of the Sea Front Sustainable Route proposals, which will provide improved cycling, walking and wheeling links to local destinations in coastal areas of North Tyneside.
