This Record of Decision relates to the approval given by the Cabinet Member for Environment to introduce full time waiting restrictions on Monks Wood, North Shields and to set aside four objections received to the proposal.

## 7. Decision(s)

The Cabinet Member for Environment has considered the objections and has decided to:

- set aside the objections in the interests of discouraging indiscriminate and obstructive parking thereby improving visibility and road safety for all road users and access for residents; and
- 2) determine that the Traffic Regulation Order should be made unchanged.

## 8. Reasons for the Decision(s)

Regarding the objections from Mr P, Ms L, Mr H and Mr S, the Cabinet Member for Environment noted that the proposed restrictions would improve road safety and access for all road users which are currently affected by obstructive parking including on footways. It was also noted that some on-street parking was being retained where appropriate to offer some provision for visitors to the area including people using the adjacent sports facilities. Regarding the suggestion by Mr S that more on-street parking should be retained, it was noted that this would restrict vehicle and pedestrian movements and compromise road safety.
