5. Executive summary (taken from written report)

This Record of Decision relates to the approval given by the Cabinet Member for Environment to introduce three sets of road humps (speed cushions) on Whitley Road, Holystone and to set aside seven objections received to the proposal.

Option 1 – Approve the recommendations set out in section 1.2 of the report and determine that road humps should be installed in accordance with the proposal.

Option 2 – Not approve the recommendations set out in section 1.2 of the report and determine that road humps should not be installed in accordance with the proposal.

7. Decision(s)

The Cabinet Member for Environment has considered the objections and has decided to:

- (1) set aside the objections in the interests of increasing safety for all road users and contributing to ensuring that highway conditions are conducive to support greater usage of cycling, walking and wheeling, and
- (2) determine that the road humps should be installed in accordance with the proposal.

8. Reasons for the Decision(s)

The Cabinet Member for Environment considered the objections received from Mr W, Mr H, Mrs WL, Mr WT, Mrs K, Mrs R, in relation to the suitability of the chosen traffic calming measures but noted officers' advice that speed cushions would be the most appropriate measure for achieving the necessary traffic speed reduction at the location in question. It was further noted that the proposed speed cushions had been designed and would be installed in accordance with the specification set out in Department for Transport guidance.

The Cabinet Member also noted the comments from Mr W, Mrs WL, Mrs K, and Mrs R relating to the consultation exercise undertaken in respect of the proposal but was satisfied that this was proportionate to the proposed scheme and in line with statutory requirements.
