This Record of Decision relates to the approval given by the Cabinet Member for Environment to approve the making of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO). The Order will introduce 'no waiting at any time' restrictions (double yellow lines); 'no loading at any time' restrictions; 'no stopping' restrictions (School Keep Clears) and extension to a 'no stopping except buses' clearway, on Hailsham Avenue in Longbenton; and to set aside five objections received to the proposal.

Regarding the objection from Ms D – the Cabinet Member for Environment noted that vehicles would still be able to travel through the turning area and that the Authority would not seek to introduce parking provision for parents at the school due to safety and environmental factors.
