

4. Executive summary (To be taken from written report)

North Tyneside currently commissions domestic abuse support services. The commissioned services are an integral part of the wider multi-agency approach to tackle domestic abuse. This is focused on prevention and early intervention as well as support for victims. The current domestic abuse contracts will terminate on 31 March 2019.

Cabinet approved the procurement of these specialist domestic abuse services on the above basis in North Tyneside on 15 October 2018.

Following this decision, a procurement exercise was carried out in accordance with the Authority's Contract Standing Orders, the Public Contracts Regulations 2015 and EU procurement regulations.

The compliant tenders were fully evaluated and the successful tenderers met the requirements set out in the service specification.
