

North Tyneside Council Gambling Act 2005

Advertisement of Applications

An applicant is required to advertise their application when applying:

- under section 159 for a premises licence (other than where the application is a fast track application)
- under section 187 to vary a premises licence, or
- under section 204 for a provisional statement.

The following two stages must be complied with for the application to be valid:

Stage 1

By displaying a notice on the premises to which the application relates in a place at which it can conveniently be read by members of the public from the exterior of the premises for a period **28 consecutive days** starting on the day the application is made to North Tyneside Council

Where the application is for a provisional statement in respect of premises, and the premises have not been constructed, or the applicant does not have the right to occupy the premises, on the date on which the application is made, the applicant must display the notice:

- as near as reasonably practicable to the premises or proposed premises, and
- where it can conveniently be read by members of the public.

Stage 2

The applicant must publish notice of the application in a local newspaper or if there is none, in a local newsletter, circular or similar document within the licensing authority's area on at least one occasion during the period of ten working days starting with the day after the day on which the application is made to North Tyneside Council.

Prescribed Notice

The notice required to be published in a local newspaper and displayed at the premises has been prescribed by regulations. Therefore the applicant must use the exact wording and layout as prescribed. Copies of the required notices are available from the Licensing Section.
