There's something for every young reader.




Sailor, dancer, teacher, vet –

friendships are torn apart?




It's Halloween - woo-hoo! and Bear is determined to

scare them both!




Follow Lucien and his playful new friend on a magical journey through the seasons and discover that every change - no matter how big or small - brings its own beauty, wonder and adventure.
